## THE GOVERNING BODY

In line with the Standards and Framework Act 1998, the Governing Body is made up of 20 members:

- Parent Governors (6), LEA representatives (5), Teacher Governors (2), Non-teaching Staff Governor (1), Co-opted/Community Governors (5), Headteacher (1)
- Representative pupils from the elected School Council regularly attend Governing Body meetings
- Governors also give their support to school functions and extra-curricular activities such as school concerts, sports events, and various Presentation ceremonies
- The Governing Body hold at least one Full Governing Body meeting per term and the various Sub-committees also meet regularly throughout the year
- No Governor has made a claim for travelling or subsistence allowance
- The Curriculum & Finance Sub-committee meet to set the school budget and regularly review it throughout the year. The budget is ratified by the Full Governing Body
- The Chair of Governors and the Clerk to the Governors can be contacted via the school
- New Welsh Government regulations have ended the previous compulsory requirement for an Annual Governor/Parent meeting as only a very small number of parents actually attended. Parents can raise a request to meet with the Governing Body up to a maximum of three times a year if there are specific matters related to the school that they wish to discuss. This would require a petition signed by either the parents of 10% of registered pupils or 30 parents, whichever is lower

## ELECTION OF PARENT GOVERNORS

- When a vacancy arises on the Governing Body for a Parent Representative, all parents are informed of the vacancy
- Next vacancies will be in September 2015
- Parents of every pupil registered at the school are entitled to stand for election and to vote for the candidate of their choice. This process is conducted through the school by way of pupil post.
- If there are more nominations than vacant places then an election by secret ballot will be held
- Minutes of the Governing Body meetings are available, on request, from the Clerk to the Governors, Mrs J Hughes

## THE SCHOOL

- Ysgol Uwchradd Caergybi is a co-educational 11-18 comprehensive school maintained by Isle of Anglesey County Council
- The school is a bilingual community designated as English (with significant Welsh), where the main medium for instruction in most subjects is English, although every effort is made to enhance the Welsh ethos and for pupils and staff to communicate through the medium of Welsh where possible
- All students are taught Welsh up to the end of Key Stage 4 as per current legislation
- There is a designated tutor group for First Language Welsh pupils who transfer from primary schools

## **SPORT & EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

- Sport is an important feature in school, both through timetabled PE lessons and the extra-curricular activities run by the PE Department. We make all pupils aware of the link between good health and exercise. Many of our pupils go on to represent the school at local, regional and national level
- In conjunction with Sports Wales a 5/60 Officer is also linked to the school whose role is to help create the environment necessary for children to take part in extra-curricular sport and physical activity on a regular basis. After consultation with pupils there is a programme of extra-curricular activities in place.
- Our teams continue to achieve sporting success in many areas. We are proud of the sportsmanlike way in which all our pupils participate in all the events they take part in. Their behaviour at these events is always impeccable and parents can be proud of their achievements.

GCSE PE : 73% of our pupils gained A\*-C grades in Summer 2014
